Precedents of President Washington:

- 1). Cabinet of advisors

### HANDOUT: President Washington and International Relations

1). England: Jay's Treaty – the British soldiers need to evacuate the forts in the Northwest Territory

France: Neutrality Proclamation – The French, under Genet, wanted the US to help in France's revolutionary war

Spain: Pinckney's Treaty – The United States can now use the Mississippi River and the port of New Orleans

2). The situation with Edmund Genet showed disrespect toward the US.

### HANDOUT: Washington's Domestic Policy:

1). The United States borrowed money from foreign countries.

2). Hamilton wanted the debts paid so that other countries would respect The United States and want to deal with us.

3). The compromises agreed upon for the acceptance of Hamilton's economic plan were that the capital would temporarily move to Philadelphia until the new one was done being built in Washington, DC.
